### Motion for a European Parliament resolution on declaring Antifa a terrorist organisation

The European Parliament,

- having regard to Rule 149 of its Rules of Procedure,
- A. Whereas American free speech activist Charlie Kirk was assassinated by a left-wing extremist;
- B. Whereas according to Europol's TE-SAT reports (2022-2024), left-wing and anarchist terrorist attacks were ten times more frequent than right-wing attacks in the European Union;
- C. Whereas Antifa-affiliated groups obstruct democratic processes, operate transnationally with opaque funding, and have alleged links to networks associated with George Soros;
- D. Whereas U.S. President Trump has announced his intention to designate Antifa as a terrorist organisation, and parliaments in the Netherlands and Hungary have advanced motions or initiatives to classify Antifa as such;
- 1. Strongly condemns extremist violence carried out under the Antifa label, which undermines rule of law, democratic order, and the safety of citizens;
- 2. Declares Antifa to be a terrorist organisation posing a direct threat to European security and welcomes initiatives in Member States to classify it as such;
- 3. Calls for a comprehensive investigation into Antifa's financial flows, sources of support, and cross-border coordination, including alleged funding links to George Soros and affiliated networks;
- 4. Urges the Commission, the Council, Europol, and Member States to prioritise dismantling Antifa networks across Europe.
